While we encourage positive attendance we do acknowledge that illness and misadventure does happen. Please stay home if you are unwell. Let the school know of the situation and we will do our best to support you no matter what the circumstance.

NAPLAN came and went this term with minimal fuss and certainly no stress! Ms Kehane, Ms G, Mr Schaefer and Chantal ran a tight ship, and all students were supported to do their best. I value NAPLAN for the process not for the results. Sitting an online exam - like one will need to do to get a learner's permit, completing a task in a set time, taking direction from a suspervisor who is not their "regular" teacher are all life skills necessary for the big wide world. When results are posted home next term focus on how well your child has done to sit these exams. View the results as a starting platform from where we

will grow. See these results as proof of your child's capability to do something out of their comfort zone and be educationally successful. These are the real achievements.

When we see consistent attendance and engagement in learning there is a noticeable improvement in behaviour. Compared to this time last year we have halved our suspensions and have significantly increased our regular reporting of positive behaviour. Students who are regular attenders have the opportunity to practice routines and understand expectations. They develop stronger relationships with staff and students and find learning easier. We again reward our students who have demonstrated more positive behaviour than negative with a principal's luncheon at the end of term. I am genuinely excited by the amount of students invited to attend. The PBIS team continue to analyze the behaviour trends of our students and are eager to consult with the community about how you feel we can best support positive behaviour across

INTSTRUCTIONAL LEADER'S REPORT



Firstly, a big congratulations to all those students who participated in NAPLAN this term. We are so proud of your efforts and know the resilience you showed turning up every day to complete the tests. A special mention must go to Gemma, Jade, Leilani, Charlie, Michael MF, Blade, Laura and Zaman who put in a tremendous effort over the fortnight. Our teaching team have engaged in developing exciting new programs this term that have challenged the thinking of students. In Science, students began the term engaging in an incursion by Fizzics Education that explored forces through

hands on gadgets. Students then experimented with all of Newton's Laws before learning the theory behind why their experiments had succeeded or failed. In English, students have been learning about the influence Bran Nue Dae had on the film industry, Broome Western Australia, the setting of the movie and the Eight Ways of Learning as well as a deep dive into stereo-typing of characters. Following from this, teachers have been explicitly supporting students in developing procedural texts. In Geography, students have made connections with the Fast Fashion industry and why people flock to more liveable cities than others. PDHPE has seen students get a taste for first aid and support services for mental health and lastly, mathematics has been all triangles and decimals with assessment results for Jade, Blade and Hayden all being over

The wellbeing team has continued to be focused on implementing the attendance policy that was written and developed in

2021. Student attendance targets have been set and it is extremely pleasing to announce that a significant number of Verona pupils met their attendance goals and participated in the attendance rewards incursion in week seven of this term. These students had the opportunity to play a range of computer games on a bus fitted out with the latest consoles and vintage arcade machines.

This term Verona School's wellbeing curriculum was overhauled, with a shift away from whole one-hour lessons to 15-minute mini lessons. These will be delivered at the beginning of lessons after lunch and recess. The mini lessons have been developed to align 'Realtime Wellbeing Survey' data collection areas within the 'Wellbeing Framework' for schools. Mini-Lessons explicitly target bullying and school attendance, allowing Verona to target and address wellbeing issues within the school and should improve academic and wellbeing outcomes for our students.

The Bushbred program continues to run successfully with classes Wattle and Tea Tree participating in term two. Students through working with the animals on the Bushbred farm have learnt patience, resilience, emotional regulation and by working with others, students have begun to empathise with the situations and life experiences of their peers.

Finally, the wellbeing team is in the process of organising a range of health initiatives such as optical assessments, hearing tests and dental check ups which are planned to take place later in the school year. These programs are planned to be conducted in collaboration with Yennora Primary School and Information has already gone out for the eye testing program. Watch this space and keep an eye out on Verona's normal chains of communication, such as notes home, email, post and phone calls for more information on these programs.

In the classroom, we have been placing emphasis on Maths and Literacy skills this term. With a


focus on number order in math and grammar in literacy skills, we have been completing daily exercises to improve these skills. This will also improve our ability to complete work in other subjects.

This then took us on a tour of how technology plays a massive part in connecting people to people, goods, services, and information in other places. Michael and Gemma showed a great interest in this topic, and they have both strengthened their understanding on why interconnections are important for the future of places and the environment.

All students from class Banksia have been attending swimming lessons as part of our schools sporting program. Michael is now capable of swimming without holding onto the wall and Younis even managed to go up a level. Hashem showed us all that he is a very capable swimmer. I am very proud of everyone's achievements in the water this year.

Class Tea Tree has again enjoyed the fitness and cooking programs and we look forward to more fun activities in these areas next term!

Progress has ramped up in our Sustainable Sensory garden. This term we have spent quite a bit of time carrying wheelbarrow loads of soil and gravel into the garden space to prepare it for planting. Students from all across the school have pitched in to help get the job done. We will have a variety of native trees, including Grevilleas, Bottlebrushes and Lilly pillies, screening off our fence line as well as a variety of native edible plants for use in our food technology program and for students to try out. There are also several raised beds filled with fruit, vegetables and herbs we can use in the kitchen. Plenty of seating areas have also been planned to allow students to use the space as a quiet area to relax and regulate their emotions if need be. Although we've seen enough rain to last us a long time, two water tanks have also been placed in the garden to give access to a sustainable supply of water for the plants. STUDENT SUPPORT OFFICER REPORT

We have had a very busy term two with many events, programs, and community-building activities. Class Boronia has continued to look after the Verona school garden, which is supported by Villawood Bunnings and Activities Officer- Jodie. The students began to learn more about seasonal plants, veggies and herbs. We also started working on improving the overall appearance of the garden with the help of Scotty from Bunnings. He helped the students do an audit of the garden; which involved learning how to use a ladder, measure the fence and brainstorm ideas to repair the fence. Another student – Makala, was accepted for a TAFE course in Hospitality. Our school event lunches have allowed Makala to put her vocational training into practice. While Chrystal and Connor did an outstanding job getting through the whole term of Horticulture class.

The Student Leadership Council was inducted at the Verona Community Day event. During the presentation, Mr Guy Zangari presented the students with their leadership certificates and the parents/carers presented their badges. Leadership program students have been trained in teamwork, problem-solving, and running formal meetings this term. In addition to supporting mini-school events and Community Day, the SLC has launched Verona's canteen. On Wednesdays, the SLC will run the school canteen, which will feature a special beverage and on Fridays, a variety of delicious treats. Students will gain skills in customer service, money handling, inventory, and teamwork at the canteen. This money will be used to purchase supplies and fund school projects.

Verona Community Day is the highlight of the school calendar. Our event this year featured extra food choices such as popcorn and slushies, amusement rides, and community service organisations such as The Smith Family, The Parks Community, Community First Step, Core Community Services, and Woodville Alliance. We acknowledged our current community partners; Jodie Rinkin Villawood Bunnings Activities Officer, Glenn Clark – Police Youth Liaison Officer and Mr Tony Correlli – Woolworths Chester Hill for their dedication and continued support to the Verona School community.
